Santiago Felipe Jacquelin instituted proceedings to recover from Monsieur Daunoy the sum of 1442 livres and ten sols covering a certain promissory note executed by him in favor of Luis Boitard who indorsed it to Jacquelin in payment of a debt.

In compliance with a Court order Daunoy under oath declared that the signature appearing on said note was his but that the sum claimed was owed by his mother and not by him, failing, however, to explain why it was so. It was later disclosed that said note was issued to cover the value of certain merchandise furnished to Daunoy's mother by Boitard.

A similar order was issued for Luis Boitard, the indorser, who also under oath acknowledged to have indorsed the promissory note in question to Jacquelin.

The two pages following the preceding declaration are illegible due to the damaged condition of the document. However, from a partially faded signature of Jacquelin and from information gathered from subsequent petitions it may be assumed that one of said pages contained a petition filed by him whereby he, having found

Daunoy and his mother to be insolvent, filed suit against Boitard as the indorser, in consequence whereof the Court ordered said Boitard, against whom the action was directed from then on, to pay the sum claimed within three days.

In his answer Boitard refused to admit any liability, alleging that the said promissory note was issued and accepted at a time when the French law was still in vigor, said law providing that in the event a creditor failed to demand payment from the principal debtor in due time he would have no action against the indorser, and in order to strengthen his argument he also cited the Spanish law which provided that the fact that the principal debtor was solvent at the time of the indorsement was sufficient cause to clear the indorser of any liability thereafter. Moreover he disclosed that in the transaction involving the indorsement of the promissory note in reference, he received from Jacquelin a certain quantity of planks for which Jacquelin overcharged him fifteen sols per plank when they cost only a half real each at the time of his petition. He therefore asked the Court to dismiss Jacquelin's suit and to order him to pay for the costs of the proceedings, but the Court denied his petition and a writ of seizure and execution was issued against his properties.

Boitard protested this and a lengthy litigation ensued with said Boitard attempting to prove that Jacquelin had no cause of action against him since he failed to demand payment first against Daunoy, the principal debtor, as prescribed by the French law under which Boitard alleged the promissory note had been executed. He cited many other laws, old and new, which he thought would help his side of the case, and as the note bore a date posterior to the invalidation

of said law, he charged that said date was erroneous, doubtlessly with the intention that by changing its date the note might be subject to the provisions of said law as he contended, and to prove the error he presented an invoice covering the merchandise he had furnished to Madam Daunoy for the payment of which her son issued said Boitard the promissory note in question. With this he intended to show that said note should have been dated on the same day as the invoice.

Jacquelin on his part denied that the note was issued under the French law cited by Boitard and he alleged that in any event there was no law which freed a debtor from paying back his creditor a sum received in cash, which in his case he proved by presenting a receipt, and that even if he should have demanded payment from Daunoy as Boitard erroneously contended, he could have under the law granted to his debtor an extension of time for as long as he wished and furthermore he stated that this action should have been taken by Boitard inasmuch as Daunoy issued him the said note on January 24, 1768, and it was indorsed to him a year after, January 26, 1769. With respect to Boitard's charge that the date on the note was erroneous he claimed to know nothing about it, but he counter-charged that the date of the invoice presented by Boitard had been obviously altered and that a certain part thereof had been cleverly clipped off. With this Jacquelin tried to prove that said alterations had been made by Boitard in order to avail himself of an evidence with which to substantiate his false allegations that the note was subject to the French law.

Finally the litigants came to an agreement whereby Boitard paid to Jacquelin the sum of 150 pesos in cash and for the balance he indorsed to Jacquelin a certain account the amount of which exceeded said balance; he also agreed to pay for the costs of the pro-

ceedings. Jacquelin on his part agreed to deliver to Boitard or to his agent the excess amount of said account in the event he obtained the full payment thereof.

The case thus ended and an itemized statement was made of the costs of the proceedings the amount of which cannot be read.

Plaintiff instituted proceedings to compel the defendant to pay a past due debt of 275 livres 5 sols, alleging that said sum arises for the value of certain merchandise bought by the defendant. The plaintiff petitions the Court to have the defendant acknowledge said debt. The defendant appeared before the Court Clerk to verify his signature and acknowledge his debt. The plaintiff then petitioned the Court to issue a writ of execution in order to seize the properties of the defendant to satisfy his claim. Governor Luis Unzaga ordered that the defendant pay within five days or writ of execution will be issued in favor of the plaintiff. The plaintiff later petitioned the Court to issue the writ of execution as the defendant had failed to pay said debt within the time prescribed by the law. Governor Unzaga through the advice of assessor Odoardo ordered that a writ of execution be issued.

The sheriff Santiago Hallay reported to the Court Clerk that he had called at the defendant's house and found that the defendant had no properties in which to execute said writ. Plaintiff then petitioned the Court to have the Clerk submit an account of the expenses of the proceedings of this case, alleging that he will keep said judgment until the defendant acquires property. The Court granted plaintiff's petition. The Court Clerk submitted an itemized statement of the expenses of these proceedings which amounted to 18 pesos 3 reales. Not translated by the La. Plaintiff instituted proceedings to compel the defendant as executor of the Prevost Estate to pay the sum of 1200 pesos, for damages suffered, caused by the crevasse of the levee constructed to protect a certain plantation of the estate of Prevost, that was leased by the defendant, alleging that the defendant misrepresented said plantation, and that the levee built in front of the plantation to protect it from river floods was not properly constructed and then high waters of the river destroyed 40 arpents of indigo, and all of his other crops, consisting of various vegetables planted to supply the slaves with food.

The plaintiff further alleges that the slaves were not able to work in the plantation because they were employed to fight the flood.

The plaintiff further alleges that the majority of the slaves that were leased with said plantation were incapacitated because of old age or disability, causing him to suffer medical expenses.

Wherefore, the plaintiff instituted this action to recover said damages. Governor Luis Unzaga y Amezaga ordered the defendant to pay the damages of the defendant, as petitioned.
