SURVEY OF A PIECE OF GROUND BY

I, the undersigned Captain of Infantry and Aide Major of the fortress at New Orleans, charged by commission of the Government with the functions of engineer and surveyor, in this Province of Louisiana, certify having this day, April 23, 1776, at the request and in the presence of the named Jacob Cristian, set the bounds on his lands situated in the district of Des Allemands, in the jurisdiction of the Parish of St. John the Baptiste (St. Jean Batiste), at about 13-1/2 leagues above the said Capitol, on the left bank of the Mississippi River, adjoining up above to the named Michel Cambre, and down below, by that of George Kerns, both of whom also assisted and consented to this boundary.

The land of the said Cristian, consist of what he told me, of four and one half arpents front or thereabouts. I did not survey them. The owner stating that he did not care to have the extent of his frontage authenticated and to abide by the space contained between these two boundaries, except of the quantity, more or less.

These two limits are parallel, both running in depth to eight degrees northwest by west in the one above boundary line with Cambre, I have had planted two boundaries of cypress wood; first of five feet, five inches long by five and one half inches thick, pointed six inches at the top and planted two feet deep in the ground, at thirty toises (180 feet) or one arpent distance from the actual edge of the

river, which is at its greatest height, and the second, of five feet nine inches long, and four by six inches square, with six inch point and placed also planted two feet, at one arpent behind the former in the line below, limited with Kerns, I equally had planted two other boundaries. The first being of mulberry of five feet, three inches long by four square inches thick, poorly squared, pointed about five inches at the top, with rough breach, planted eighteen inches deep in the ground at one arpent distance from the actual edge of the river, and the last is of cypress six feet two and one half inches long, by five by seven inches square, with a six and one half inch point, planted two feet on another arpent behind the former.

In witness whereof I have signed the present verbal process; the proprietor and his two neighbors having declared they could not write or sign, which I certify as being the truth. At Allemandes on the day, month and year mentioned at the top of the present.

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STATEMENT OF SURVEYING OF LAND BELONGING TO  
MR. A. VICNER, APRIL 23, 1776.

I, undersigned Captain of Infantry and Aid Major of the city at New Orleans, holding a Government commission as Civil Engineer and Surveyor in this Parish of Louisiana, certify having today the 23rd day of April 1776, at the request and in presence of Sieur Adam Vicner set the boundaries of his land, consisting, which he says, of about four and a half arpents front more or less situated at the district Des Allemands in the jurisdiction of St. Jean Baptiste Parish at about thirteen leagues above that above mentioned capital on the left bank of the river, adjoining up above Sieur Balthazar Vicner's known as Palsy, his brother and below the succession of the late Joseph Carandin, whose widow and the said Balthazar were likewise present and consented to the setting of the bounds.

I have not surveyed that land, the proprietor having told me that he did not care to have its extent proved and would stand by the space contained between the two limits without prejudice to the superfluity.

They (the limits) are parallels and running in length eight degrees north by west.

In the one up above, party boundary between the two brothers, Balthazar and Adam Vicner, I have set two posts of mulberry wood, the first one four feet 10 inches high and six by seven inches square, ten inches pointed top and a reinforced lower surface, set eighteen inches into the ground

at a distance of 174 feet from the actual river edge, which is at its highest level.

The second boundary post, five feet high, six inches and half square in thickness, eleven inches pointed top and rough lower surface, set eighteen inches in the ground 186 feet behind the precedent.

In the lower line bordering the succession of Joseph Carandin, I have likewise set two other boundary posts of the same mulberry wood; the first one four feet and half high and seven by eight inches square in thickness, about a nine inch pointed top with a lower reinforced surface, set twenty two inches in the ground and ~~was~~ 180 feet from the actual edge of the river, and the last one four feet eight inches high, eight inches square in thickness, eight inches pointed top, lower reinforced surface, set also eighteen inches in the ground, 180 feet behind the precedent.

In testimony whereof I have drawn up the present statement which I have signed with the proprietor, Adam Vicner and Balthazar Vicner, his brother; the widow Carandin having declared to be unable to sign.

I certify the above to be true,
