Don Pedro Lyonnet, resident of this City, petitioned the Court for the purpose of obtaining a permit to sell a certain negro slave acquired at French St. Domingo, from Mr. Sauvage, through a private contract executed between themselves, which private slaes are very much in use in St. Domingo. Said contract written in French is presented as evidence and further petitioned the Court to accept the declaration of two witnesses who would prove that he is owner of said negro.

By the time I got this far, it became evident that I was not going to be able to get through all the letters in the day, plus one hour of yesterday, which I had decided was a "fair sample" of work for you. It took me three hours to get hold of the legajo and find the letters in it; and three hours more to take the foregoing notes.

In the remaining few minutes I ran hastily through the rest of the letters. There are perhaps one-third as many more in this one year of 1780. June and July are very full and the other months are represented, through December. The Natchez uprising and allied events came in for consideration.

One letter, dated November 15, is in Spanish with a marginal note in French: Cest icy ma premiere Lettre en espagnole; je vous prouve au moins ma bonne volontiers de toujours bien faire.

I made the attached two tracings of Favrot's signature - and one little one of an abbreviation of his signature which he used like an initial.

If my estimate is correct and there remain a third of the letters for 1780 in this legajo, then it would cost you approximately \$50 to photocopy the lot. When you had them you would have a pretty good

history of Baton Rouge for the year 1780 - I mean translated and edited for publication, these letters would be a valuable contribution to the history of the place for that time. Further investigation would doubtless discover more for that year, but I venture to say that here you have the bulk of Favrot's reports for 1780.

And, like this, in thirty-nine other legajos you can discover similar material concerning him down to say 1803 or thereabouts.

An ancestor like this is an embarrassment of riches!

Worse yet, concerning the others you mention you can have as much, or pretty nearly as much more. This very legajo is full of letters from Chev. de Clouet. Which DuBreuil interests you - Jacobo or Raymundo. Jacobo will be even more prolific in documents. As for Raymundo - he was charming, so charming that I have already translated a lot of his letters from Manchac, 1779, and they are now with Mr. Beer. I sent them with request that he furnish an introduction, some notes and find a publisher - not much to ask of an obliging stranger. I haven't heard from him, but I am sure he will let you see that mss. There never was a more charming gentleman than Raymundo. Jacobo was doubtless the more prominent of the two brothers. (Mr. Beer of the Howard Memorial - it occurs to me just now that you may have difficulty "seeing" from Baton Rouge to New Orleans! However, that little work of mine is enough on Raymundo, although it does not exhaust him. If it is all the same to you, you stick to Jacobo! I am glad that Raymundo fell to me to "work." I hope that essay does see print for it will please his descendants - he was such a childlike, honest, good chap. I have since seen other letters of his - one, for instance,

warmly defending Dutisne, who was under suspicion.

In 1780, I think it was, DuBreuil fell ill, and the last I saw of him he was going down the Mississippi to New Orleans, stubbornly refusing to make a will or confess, and carrying all his papers with him. He liked the English - and, when he knew war was declared and they did not, he simply could not accept their invitation to dinner - he had a convenient cold. The English liked and respected him. As I have said in that work - not an able man, he was nevertheless useful in his time and place, and 141 years (which are as yesterday in this Archive) have not tarnished the lustre of his good heart and his good breeding.)

Really, Mr. Favrot, I do not know what to recommend to you in this work. Don Pedro Jose alone furnishes an awful lot of material. Jacobo DuBreuil, the Chevalier would certainly be just as bulky, and Trudeau and Villars little less so. If you want details of their services, but no copies or photocopies of documents, then invest in investigation. At \$1 an Hour I will work conscientiously for you, as long as you like. I can and will take more complete, closer notes than the foregoing - which are intended to give you a general idea. From such notes you can decide what are the more important documents, if you want only those copied. Until you have made such investigation you cannot select. You can't choose until you know what there is to choose from. Having investigated and chosen, you certainly ought to publish - "The Letters of Pedro Jose de Favrot," "The Letters of the Chevalier de Clouet," - in the original or in translation, annotated.

Please call the attention of your local patriotic and historical societies to the immense value of the papers over here. In this connection, see Roscoe E. Hill's Guide, published by the Carnegie Institution

Washington, D. C. (J. Franklin Jameson, Woodward Building, Washington, head of the Historical Department). That guide will give you a general idea of what's here. It will not enable you to order specifically, but, as a general guide, you need to have it at hand.

Now, as stated, the foregoing represents six hours work. If it satisfies you, please remit \$6.40 in draft in dollars on New York. I return stamps for I cannot use them here. A New York draft is the best money in the world just now.

I would like further orders from you, and, if you have any publications (a bulletin or magazine issued by the Baton Rouge Historical Society) please send me a sample copy; and if you have a stray copy of the Louisiana Society's publication, do send me that. I have asked in vain of that society's secretary.

CASE OF
DON LUIS GENTILLY
VERSUS
DON CARLOS LA TOUR.

The plaintiff, a resident of this City, appointed Don Rafael Perdomo, as his attorney in order to take action against the defendant to recover the sum of 240 pesos past due as per the promissory note presented. The petitioner asked the Court to order the defendant to appear and declare whether the signature affixed at the foot of said document was his and whether he owed the plaintiff the sum claimed. As the defendant resided in the country, the petitioner begged the Court to notify him to settle this account, which petition was granted.

Since the defendant admitted he owed the aforesaid sum to the plaintiff, the latter begged the Court to issue a writ of execution against the person and properties of the defendant sufficient to cover said claim plus the cost of the proceedings.

The Court ordered the defendant to pay said sum within three days, but before resorting to further action the plaintiff informed the Court that the defendant had paid him in full and that he would also pay for the cost of the proceedings which the record does not show.
