RENE BOYER VS. ROSSARD.

René Boyer, inhabitant, states that having formed a partnership with the late Sr. de Clairfontaine, they were granted, as shown in petition and ordinance of June 3, 1724, twelve arpents of ground on the Mississippi River above and adjoining property of Widow Carrière (now wife of Sr. Tixerant). Shortly thereafter they jointly acquired two negroes, one of whom was short-lived and the other deserted and has been unheard of for 2 years, consequently, they derived no benefits therefrom; however, petitioner has improved his land to the best of his ability; moreover, two negroes belonging to the deceased have left on the vessel "La Dianne" to whom he has become obligated. The attorney for vacant estates wishes to lodge a claim against said two negroes, which procedure would totally incapacitate petitioner and place him in default with the Company.

Petitioner prays that he be confirmed in possession and enjoyment of his land, and that he be granted the said two negroes upon his personal assumption of indebtedness to the Company, conformably to terms and condition offered to other inhabitants.

Petition: Charges of Cruelty

Louise Jousset La Loire, wife of Surgeon Pierre de Manade, appears before the Council's Clerk and files a petition for separation of bed and board and separate in property. Petitioner alleges she married de Manade in the early part of 1720, bringing as dowry a considerable sum, enough to insure peace and union; instead that while in Mobile, 6 months after their marriage, de Manade mistreated petitioner, beating her over the head with a hammer because she did not correctly hold a piece of wood de Manade was cutting. Later, for no reason, he again beat her with a stick and kicked her so badly that Mr. de Beauchamps, Major at Mobile, found her covered with blood upon entering her home. They moved to Biloxi where de Manade again got into a furious rage because petitioner had not cooked a chicken fricassee properly and threw a knife towards her face. Once she was forced to remain in bed 15 days after a beating. On coming to New Orleans later, de Manade again beat her with a cane in the presence of several people and thereafter because of a pair of strayed pigeons he again beat her. Once she was forced to go to Attorney General Fleuriau's home for protection. About a month ago petitioner alleges because she

cooked a soup with meat instead of cabbages de Manade beat her unmercifully with a shovel, tongs and a cane, putting her in such a pitiful state that she is determined to leave him and put herself in the convent of the Ursulines and demand a separation of bed and board and separate in property. Petitioner states that de Manade has dissipated practically all of her dowry and that she is in dire necessity.

COUNTER-SUIT OF ROSSARD, ADMINISTRATOR OF
VACANT ESTATES

Rossard, alleges that after the death of Pierre Bordier who was drowned at the time of the shipwreck of the vessel "La Bellone", he filed a petition with the Court on December, 1727, praying for the return of the negro slaves, the cows and their young which were in the hands of Trudeau. Order was issued on the first of February that the cattle and slaves be turned over to him until such time as the payment or non-payment of letters was established. On August 16 an order was issued postponing the case until the arrival of the next vessel, but more than one vessel has arrived and Mr. De Noyan still retains the slaves and cattle. Even if the drafts were not yet paid, these movables cannot be held indefinitely against preferred claims.

He therefore prays that the slaves and cattle be returned, and hire paid for slaves from February 1, 1727 at rate of 4 francs a day for each slave, until day of restitution.
