

Proces verbal of raising of seals
which had been affixed on the
effects of the Succession
subject thereto, which were
found at the Concession of St. Reine
and
Inventory of Movable and Immovable
Property at said place.

The inventory was taken by order of the Superior Council on the petition of the Procurator General and in the presence of the Administrator of Vacant Successions, for the conservation of the rights of the Company of the Indies, the widow and heirs of decedent and the creditors of said succession.

Francois Varlut, caretaker, and in charge of the seals which had been affixed on the effects subject thereto, declared under oath that nothing had been diverted from the property.

There were inventoried among other things, household furniture and furnishings on a large scale, including silverware, crystal, tapestry, porcelain and porcelain-handle knives; wearing apparel, boots, bolts of dry goods of various grades, from 3 bolts of serge to "goods for negroes", taffeta bonnets, 28 pairs of men's gloves, 27 pairs of women's gloves, ribbons, pins and other notions, 18 bags of face powder; a bookcase and approximately 100 books; candelabra and 12 pounds of

candles; 2 large water jars; a box containing 100 panes of glass; 116 large cypress boards; medicine and medicine chests; large quantities of tobacco and rice; scales, patty (cake) molds; tools, agricultural implements, anvil, bellows, and 500 pounds of scrap iron; 300 bottle corks; a miniature chapel with vessels and ornaments; a plantation measuring 43 arpents front on the Mississippi River by a depth to Lake Pontchartrain, with house and other improvements thereon; 27 negroes, 21 negresses and 27 negro children; 32 head of cattle, horses, mares, colts, poultry and 200 pairs of pigeons.

The numerous documents found among the effects of decedent were placed in a chest to be taken to New Orleans by the parties to be examined and inventoried.

The inventoried movables were also to be taken to New Orleans, to be sold, except the scrap iron which would be sold at the plantation when the occasion arose.

It is stated that all of the parties have signed the original inventory except Genouy, who declared that he did not know how to sign.

The Pirogue equipped by Messrs. Périer and de la Chaise, to speedily proceed to Ft. Chartres, has advised correspondent of the Massacre of the French at Natchez, Yazoo and on the River. Fortunately, all were found alive, having escaped the tragic conspiracy; although the Chicachas invited the Illinois to said fort for a conference last Summer, and urged them to join in said plot, the latter Indians were unseen by the settlers, who were ignorant of their plans prior to the arrival of Messrs. Girardot and Coulange. The foregoing offers conclusive proof of ill designs, which are probably persisting. However, actual fortification and preparedness to evade a surprise by the barbarians is in progress; they are untrustworthy and the residents are in constant danger of strangulation if unguarded.

Mr. de Ternan has been informed, by Mr. Coulange, of the safe arrival of the onions, prior to the Natchez Massacre, which was along their route.

Thirty-six (36) choice hams are being sent by Coulange; Mr. Rossard is to make the first selection, the remainder to be disposed of to best advantage by the Ordinary. Writer hears that some English plate has reached the Store and would appreciate the securing of a portion thereof, same may be entrusted

to Mr. de la Chaise, together with other provisions for the Company's boat.

It is rumored here that the late Mr. Delorme succumbed while on his way to relieve Mr. de la Chaise. Information in this regard and news of "your capital" is desired.

Sr. Jean de Reytet, Surgeon-Major of New Orleans, on the petition of the Procurator General, certifies that on the 26th of June, 1730, he repaired to the bank of the Mississippi River, between the bakery and the mill, where, in the presence of Mr. Brusle, Director-General, and Mr. Rossard, Clerk of Court, he found the body of a certain Pierre Prayver, aged about 26 years.

(Here follows description of the body).

Sr. de Reytet further certifies that he has examined the body, by virtue of the King's orders, and has ascertained that said Prayver has died by drowning and that no wounds were found to have been inflicted before the accident.
