Michel Bordier, baker, supplying bread to the soldiers, having, during the month of November and December, 1731, and January, 1732 drawn from the King's stores a quantity of flour exceeding his allowance, and having always refused to make a settlement, Mr. Pellerin, store-keeper, reports to Mr. Salmon, intendant commissary of the Province of Louisiana, that he was compelled to send a Marine guard to notify him and then the said Bordier, thus summoned, decided to make a report which after being audited, balanced and signed by the said Michel Bordier, showed he was indebted to the store-keeper to the amount of 9097 pounds of French flour valued at 2046 livres, 16 sols, 9 deniers.

Mr. Pellerin, store-keeper, petitions Mr. Salmon to compel the said Bordier to pay the said balance, and if not to have him imprisoned and to have all his possessions and effects seized, and to hold him in prison until full payment of his debt to the store-keeper.
