PROBATE OF

In the year 1736, on January 20<sup>th</sup>, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, we Edme Gatien de Salmon, Commissioner of the Navy, Intendant and Senior Judge of the Superior Council of the Province of Louisiana, have, in the presence of the Procurator General for the King and of Messrs. Bizoton and Raguét, opened the olographic will and testament made, written and signed by the hand of Jean Louis, an inhabitant of Louisiana, who died at New Orleans today at the hour of noon, beginning with these words "In the Name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. Nothing being more certain than death" etc., and ending with the following words: "and for the purpose of executing and fulfilling its conditions in their entirety I appoint Monsieur "Raguet" (Raguét), Councilor of the Superior Council of this Province, begging him to be kind enough to take charge thereof and to treat it as though it were something belonging to him, without obligation on his part to render an accounting to any one whomsoever, and without the supervision of an officer of justice, as I have entire confidence in his honesty and loyalty. At New Orleans, November 16, 1735. (Original signed) Jean Louis."

And after having read said will and testament and considering that said testament has been

made in duplicate, one copy thereof has been remitted to the Clerk of Court to serve as may be advisable and the other has been remitted to said Sr. Raguet, who has taken charge thereof of his own free will and bound himself to cause it to be executed with all the exactness possible, of which we have caused the present proces verbal to be drawn up by our clerk, together with certificate thereof, and the parties hereinabove mentioned have signed these presents with us, at New Orleans, on the day and in the year hereinabove written.

Sr. Fleuriau, Procurator General, represents that he has just learned that Sr. Bachemin Corbin, a planter who resided at a distance of two and a half leagues from the city, has died; that decedent left a widow and several minor children, for some of whom it is necessary to elect a tutor and special tutor, and for others of whom a curator will be needed; that Sr. Brusle, agent of the Company of the Indies, to whom decedent was indebted, has petitioned for the affixing of seals and taking of inventory, but that no steps can be taken pending the election of a tutor, special tutor and curator to said minors, respectively, their mother being in poor health and unable to act as their tutrix.

Petitioner prays for an order to convene a family meeting in behalf of said minors, for the purpose of electing a tutor, special tutor and curator.

## Inventory of P roperty

The inventory was taken by Sr. Bizoton, acting for Judge Salmon, on the petition of Sr. Pierre Dreux, tutor of the younger minor children of decedent, and in the presence of Sr. Raguet, Commissioner, Councilor, and curator of the partially emancipated minors; and in the presence of the Procurator General for the King.

The property inventoried consisted chiefly of household furniture and furnishings, 30 pounds of brown sugar, three barrels of rice, plus unthreshed rice in barn, 15 barrels of potatoes, 18 hens, 12 turkeys, 9 head of cattle, 10 slaves, and a plantation measuring 15 arpents front by the usual depth, including about 100 arpents of cleared land.

The sale was made by order of the Superior Council on the petition of Sr. Prevost, Administrator of Vacant Successions, and after compliance with formalities of notice and publication, for the purpose of preventing deterioration, and satisfying the claims of opposing creditors.

The effects sold consisted in part of a few pieces of furniture, household utensils, clothes, oil, and a turning-lathe with the tools pertaining thereto.

Seven slaves are inventoried, but there are notations to the effect that three of them belong to other successions and have been claimed by Sr. Prevost (in his official capacity as Administrator of Vacant Successions).

A few personal papers are inventoried, followed by a long detailed list of the records of Court of which decedent was the custodian, and his numerous notarial acts.

There follows a list of cattle which are on Sr. de Bellile's plantation.
