Personally appeared before the Royal Notary in the Province of Louisiana and the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, Sieur Joseph Villars Dubreuil, Building Contractor for his Majesty, residing in New Orleans, who of his own free will has declared and confessed that he has executed a contract with Mr. Raguet, in the name of and acting as Director and Administrator of the Hospital for the Poor of this city, called the "St. Jean" (St. John), founded by Jean Louis, deceased, a resident of said city of New Orleans, with the advice and consent of Reverend Father Philipe, Priest and Superior of the Reverend Capuchin Fathers of the Province and "pro-vicar" of Monsignor of Quebec, also here present, and that in order to conform to the wishes of said Jean Louis, deceased, and to his decision made in the presence of Mr. de Salmon, on March 29, 1736, to the effect that a sick ward and buildings suited to housing the poor be built at the discretion of said Sr. Raguet, in view of the fact that the house in which they are lodged is too small, Sr. Du Breuil binds, obligates and engages himself by these presents to cause to be built and constructed on the grounds of said hospital an edifice 45 feet in length by 25 feet in width, and 14 feet in height including the foundations, the whole with brick walls well conditioned

\* - Hospital in French means both "Asylum for the Poor" and a place for taking care of the sick.

and open to inspection, and according to the plan and specifications hereto attached, which work he binds himself to have executed for the price and sum of 200 livres per cubic toise, full or empty, and the other articles such as lumber, planks, blankets, locks and the workmanship on all of them at the price at which he furnishes articles of that sort to his Majesty in connection with the undertakings which he has directed in this country. Said works shall begin as soon as possible.

Whereupon there was given and delivered to said Sr. Du Breuil by said Sr. Raguet the sum of 3000 livres in coin on account, for which these presents will serve as a receipt; and it has been agreed that he shall be paid as the work advances; To secure said payment Sr. Du Breuil has mortgaged and hypothecated all his property, present and future,

Promising, renouncing, each for himself.

Done and passed at New Orleans, in the forenoon, in the year 1736, the 10th of June, in the presence of Sieurs Augustin Chantalou and \_\_\_\_\_ Roumier, witnesses residing at said place, who have signed with said parties.

The above-named gentlemen certify, on the petition of Sr. de Macarty and his wife, Françoise Trepagnier, formerly widow Damaron, that an inventory of the property of said succession was taken in their presence on June 20, 1735, by Mr. Rossard (now deceased); that to the best of their remembrance said property consisted of a house and lot facing the Mississippi River, of four slaves (two negresses with each a small child), a mattress and linen; that the said inventory cannot be found owing to the confusion following Mr. Rossard's death; that said widow declared under oath that she had diverted nothing from the effects of the succession which had preceded her to the French Cape and which she found badly damaged; that she was compelled, however, to sell five of the slaves of said succession to pay passage of herself, her husband and child, and living expenses at the Cape.

- To his son-in-law, Sr. Ozonne, promissory notes, including those covering purchase price of Illinois flour, on the condition that Sr. Ozonne pay testator's funeral expenses.
