Partnership agreement between Sieurs Carriere called Malozé, and Antoine Aufrere, both residents of this Colony, in which Sieur Carriere contracted to furnish supplies for four vessels of the King. Finding himself unable to finance the project alone, a partnership was formed with Sieur Antoine Lefrère, Carriere to supervise work in person and to furnish one negro slave; Aufrere to furnish four slaves who will be fed at expense of said company until completion of said boats. Aufrere to produce the negroes on demand of Carrière to begin work. In case of natural death of slaves, the owner is to be sole loser, but should slaves meet their death as result of accident while at work the value of the negroes or negroe are to be pro-rated between the two partners.

Both parties are to share equally all profits as well as losses. The residue to be equally divided between them upon completion and delivery of said boats.
