Testator, after recommending his soul to God and to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of St. Peter, his patron saint, declares that he desires to be buried as plainly as is consistent with his station in life, the matter to be decided by his universal legatee hereinafter named, except that testator desires that there be conducted a religious service following his death (at the funeral) and another on the first anniversary of his death.

Testator declares that he owns the property which he occupies, as well as the furniture and merchandise therein; that he owes nothing, except barber expenses and a few other small current debts, which he charges his universal legatee to pay.

Testator names as his universal legatee Dame Catherine Hubert, widow of Lavigne, in recognition of kind services rendered and to be rendered by her to testator.

In the event of the death of Dame Lavigne, testator desires that Jacques, her son, receive the sum of 1000 crowns, by preference over the heirs of his mother.

Testator bequeaths to Pierre Guidore, his god-child, 300 livres, to be used in the building of a house, the money to be remitted only to the workmen engaged in the erection.

Testator desires that his universal legatee pay to Louis Boissiere the sum of 200 livres in recognition of services rendered.

They agree to the community of acquets and gains, according to the custom of Paris.

The dowry of the future wife consists of the property shown in the inventory taken in the Succession of Sr. de Lery, her first husband, as well as any property which may fall to her in the future, one third of all of which shall belong to the community, the other two-thirds to be reserved for the children who may be born of said marriage.
