Lessee guarantees the safety of said slaves during the existence of said lease against accidents on the lake and the fall of a furnace, and in the event said slaves should become ill during that period, he binds himself to take care of them, without reduction of the lease price, it being understood, however, that labor time lost through such illness shall be made up by said slaves after the expiration of the present lease, without cost to lessee.

Lessor reserves the right, in the event said negroes should be stricken with illness of long duration to take them back and care for them, in which event deduction shall be made on the lease price for the period of their absence, unless they be replaced by others.

Lessee shall not be held responsible for the escape or natural death of said negroes or for accidents to them caused by savages, which shall be considered as caused by an enemy.
