The parties found with the corpse Sr. Nicolas Judice, brother of decedent, and Mesdames Moreau and Carmouche (known as Lorrain), neighbors, all of whom, upon being interrogated, replied that they had been present at the death of Sr. Judice and had remained with the body, but that they had no knowledge that anything had been diverted from the effects of said succession, whereupon seals were affixed to the effects subject thereto and an inventory of the property was taken.

It appears by this proces verbal that Jacques Judice in his last will and testament had named Sr. Darby as his testamentary executor and tutor to his minor child, and Sr. Nicolas Judice, decedent's brother, as special tutor".

The family meeting, which included said Nicolas Judice and friends of said minor in default of other relatives, was convened to elect a tutor and special tutor to the minor, presumably without regard to the aforesaid testamentary clause, but the members were requested by the Procurator General to act in conformity to the last will of decedent, by electing Sr. Darby as tutor to said minor and Sr. Nicolas Judice as special tutor.

Only three of the friends of said minor, namely, Sieurs Carmouche, Riliex and Chantalou, voted according to the wishes of decedent. Sieurs Cantrelle, Songy and Cariton were in favor of Sr. Nicolas Judice, uncle of the minor, as tutor, and Sr. Darby as special tutor.

Sr. Nicolas Judice voted for Sr. Cantrelle as tutor and Sr. Chastang as special tutor. Sr. Chastang was in favor of the uncle of the minor as tutor and Sr. Cantrelle as special tutor.

In view of the divided opinions of the family meeting, Judge Raguet referred its deliberations to the Council, to be submitted to the Procurator General for his conclusions thereon.
